

Parish Pastoral Council

The Parish Pastoral Council is a committee of people who work with the priest to oversee the life of the parish. Its role is to look at the needs of the parish and see how the parish can build on its strengths. It also addresses the different needs of different groups of parishioners e.g. the elderly, the sick, families and our young people. The PPC helps to bring the views of parishioners to the meetings. It has a consultative role but also helps in practical ways when needed. It is resourced by the Diocesan Pastoral Renewal Team based in Killarney.

Among some of the items that we have organised over the past twelve months:

Our Parish Mission: was conducted by the Redemptorist Mission team last October and it was a great success. There was a different theme each of the seven nights involving young and old.

Our 'Ministers of Prayer' continued to be involved in the Parish - leading the Stations of the Cross, Rosary, and Prayer Services. They also helped the priest at prayers services and at the reception of a remains at the church on the eve of funerals. This ministry will need to be developed further in the months and years ahead as the number of priests diminish.

Pastoral Ministry Courses: One parishioner has just been awarded a Diploma in Biblical and Theological studies having completed a three year course at The Dominican Biblical Centre. Limerick. And just recently seven parishioners were presented with certificates accredited by the Diocese of Kerry and presented by Bishop Ray Browne having graduated in the Pastoral Ministry Course which was run over a 20 week period which was run over the past academic year at Ardferret Retreat Centre. Most of these people are already involved in various ministries in the Parish and these courses have helped to deepen their faith and become more actively involved in our parish. It is hoped that another group of lay people will do a similar course in either Pastoral Ministry or Youth Ministry beginning next October.

Our lovely Parish Meeting Room adjacent to the church, has also been a great help and is available to Parish Groups involved in Church activities. Our sincere thanks to the ladies who took it upon themselves to provide a 'cuppa' to parishioners after the First Friday 10.30 a.m. Mass. The Parish Meeting Room can be booked through the Parish Office. Should there be any way you feel we can make our parish a better place, please feel free to contact us as we are only too happy to help.



Listowel Area Pastoral Council




Over the past five years, the Diocese has been implementing a Pastoral Plan 2008 – 2013. That plan is now being reviewed as we look forward and form a vision for the next five years. All parishes across the Diocese are being encouraged to work together in clusters of parishes called a "Pastoral Area". We have two clusters in North Kerry. Ballydonoghue, Ballybunion, Ballylongford and Tarbert work together as one cluster known as the North Kerry cluster and we are in the Listowel Pastoral Area which includes Listowel, Lixnaw, Duagh and Moyvane.

These parishes work together, e.g. to train ministry groups such as Eucharistic Ministers, Ministers of the Word, Choirs etc. They also support each other for parish programmes such as talks for Lent or Advent. Two such talks were organised this past Lent.

The priests also give support to each other when help is needed, especially during times of illness or holiday. We have a roster of cover for duty for weekdays and weekends. The mutual co-operation is to help strengthen the individual parishes while co-operating with each other too.

Each of the parishes has their own Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) which usually meets about once every six weeks. Two members from each PPC, or one from each church area, meet with the priests who form the **Area Pastoral Council**. They meet once a quarter- each of the four parishes hosts a meeting once a year. Listowel Pastoral Council is continually addressing such issues of concern as: 'Co-operation', 'How to engage more young people in Church life', 'How to engage those who don't connect with parish or church', and the 'Questioning of the Church's teaching on a range of issues'. It is our hope that, as a Pastoral Area, we would build on the positives of our parishes, use all the given talents already there, and reach out more to the alienated and our youth, and provide education and faith-training for adults.

Children's' Liturgy Group

A new initiative commenced in the parish in December when a group of parents came together to help make the Gospel more relevant and meaningful for children attending mass. Once each month- at the Vigil mass- this group took the children to read and discuss the Gospel of the day in the Meeting Room beside the church. The children and parents who wished to accompany their children were invited to join the leaders before the Liturgy of the Word and returned to join the congregation after the homily.

A special children's leaflet is available for children at all masses and this is used in the children's Gospel group.

All children 5 and over are welcome. It will commence again in September, this time at the 11 am Sunday mass.

Mission Bazaar Group

Divine Mercy

There is great devotion to the Divine Mercy. The Divine Mercy Prayers are said each weekday morning immediately after the 10.30 a.m. Mass. Once again a service was held in honour of the Divine Mercy on the second Sunday of Easter and it was most successful.

Lectio Devina Group

This is a group that is scripture based. It meets every Tuesday morning in the Parish Meeting Room after the 10.30 a.m. Mass (excluding the Summer months). They discuss and reflect on the scripture readings of the week ahead.

Vincent de Paul (SVDP)

The Society of Saint Vincent de Paul meet regularly, and run the weekly Bingo, the St. Vincent de Paul shop, the 'Meals on Wheels' and help the poor and marginalised in our parish in so many ways. Offertory Collection

The weekly Offertory Collection is taken up during Mass. It is the cash you put on the Offertory Plate and the regular, weekly, white envelopes. It is used for the day-to-day expenses and the capital expenditure of the parish which includes: the Diocesan Levies / Staff Wages / Insurance & Security / Light & Heat / Routine and Capital Expenditure / Telephone / Printing / Postage / Stationary / Altar Requisites / Missalettes. The total amount raised in 2013 was **€176,990.00**.

The priest's income is separate and is not paid from this collection and it is dealt with under its own heading.

Parish Envelope System:

The Parish Envelope System was introduced in March 2011. The 'envelope system' is the norm in all the parishes of the Diocese nowadays. The box includes all the envelopes used for the different offerings at various times of the year. The weekly and special envelopes can be placed on the Offertory Plate or in the Offertory Basket, or dropped into the Parish Office. Some parishioners chose to pay once a year by cheque or pay by direct debit. There are many benefits to using the 'parish envelope system' as we record in a confidential manner (*known only to the Parish Secretary*) the offering that you give to your parish and priest throughout the year. Should your total offerings in a calendar year for everything be in excess of **€250.00**, and you are a tax payer the parish can claim a tax rebate currently 31%. A total of **€15,999.00** was raised in 2013. Sincere thanks to you all who returned your forms. The envelope box also includes the 'Priest's Offering', which supports your priest or assisting clergy throughout the year. These envelopes have replaced what was traditionally known as the 'Station Dues' for Spring and Autumn & Christmas & November offerings.

Priests Income

The priest's income (salary) comes from two sources, firstly, the Special Collections held in the Spring and Autumn, and the November and Christmas Offerings and, secondly, the offerings given for Baptisms, Funerals & Weddings. The priest is considered as self-employed by the Revenue Commissioners and he pays his own income tax directly each year. The salary was **€36,620.00** and **€10,000.00** was given to the Diocesan Fraternity Fund which supports the priests of poorer parishes within the Diocese. Also **€3,500.00** was given to the Diocesan Multiple Stipend Fund from Mass Offerings, which goes to the Bishop's charity. The Parish pays half of the priest's VHI and half of the Presbytery heating oil. Your generosity and support of your priest(s) is very much appreciated.

Some notes on our Financial Statements:

Over the past 12 months we continued various repairs and maintenance works to our parish buildings. Last Autumn, we installed a 'CCTV system' into the church for health and safety reasons and a 'Loop System' for the hard of hearing. We also up-graded and replaced much of the electrical lighting. Our immediate concern now is addressing the church floor problem. Much of the church floor is as when the church was built and it has become worn, unsightly and uneven. If only for health and safety reasons alone we had to address it. That is our big project for this Summer. We appreciate that it will inconvenience people but it will be fabulous when completed. It is scheduled to start at the beginning of June and completed before the end of July. It is a much bigger project than we initially thought as on further investigation we discovered that under much of the floor there was no foundation. The marley tiles going up the aisle were put down in 1958 and have served us well. It will add greatly to our beautiful church. Later this year we will look at the prospect of broadcasting our liturgies on line. Also, there are many of the stained glass windows buckled and that problem will have to be addressed sooner or later. All of these things can only be done if we can afford them. We are conscious of the recessionary times in which we live but we are also conscious that it pays to keep maintaining everything regularly.

The Diocesan Levies go towards the administration costs of the Diocese and are used solely for this purpose. The Parish Finance Council expresses sincere thanks to you for your financial support. Your generosity is much appreciated and makes it possible to run the parish and undertake these structural activities when necessary.

He literally was the Priest's 'right hand man'. On behalf of the parish community and all the priests who worked with him, we want to thank Billy, and indeed all his family, for his kindness and dedication to our parish. There will be a party in the Listowel Arms to mark Billy's retirement on Friday, June 13th. We hope that he enjoys his retirement and we welcome his replacement, Helen Moylan of Cherry Tree Drive. We wish Helen every blessing in her new role with us.
